## Affordable Housing Happenings

*Fall is a busy time for ADFAC's Affordable Housing Program!*

Bronzie Harris, ADFAC Construction Manager, just completed the Resnet Home Energy Rater System (HERS) training and after completing additional requirements will be considered a certified rater. This will give Bronzie the ability to conduct Duct Blaster and blower door tests on all ADFAC homes and determine if they meet Energy Star Standards.



AmeriCorps is going to be providing us a Volunteer Coordinator! Our partner, Appalachia Habitat, has secured the grant and will coordinate this position for the region. We are delighted to receive this position; it will make a tremendous difference in our ability to coordinate projects that are completed by volunteers on a regular basis.



The Affordable Housing Program just received a very valuable donation - **PROPERTY!** An Oak Ridger saw an article in the paper about our new build single homes, liked what we were doing and decided to donate land to ADFAC! This has saved us many dollars - and now we will build a home for a family in a nice Clinton subdivision.



AHP currently has 2 new constructions going on simultaneously. This is the first time we have engaged contractors to build single family units that are situated right next door to each other. Both houses began in July and should be complete in October. The two homes will make the 5th and 6th new homes constructed in Oak Ridge.

## Over 1,350 students receive school supplies

Over the course of several weeks this summer, more than **1,350** students were served through ADFAC's School Supplies program.

This number includes the students that came to ADFAC's offices to choose their supplies (1181), but also includes students that have been assisted through a new program offered this year. 11 Anderson County schools received a box of school supplies to be used as needed for low income families, serving an additional 100+ students. Two schools in Morgan and Roane counties also received boxes, serving about 15 students at each school.
